Kraków-Przegorzały, Poland, 28-30 September 2009

This workshop is one of a series of seminars organized every even year by Humboldt University of Berlin and every odd year by Warsaw University. Workshop venue:

The meeting will take place in Kraków-Przegorzały, a vicinity of Kraków, about 6 km. to the west of the city-centre and railway station. The conference site is on a forested hill-top near the Vistula river in a modern building offering accommodation of various standard, restaurant and conference facilities. Some 100 meters from the building is a small castle housing another restaurant and cafeteria. The conference site belongs to the Jagiellonian University, one of the earliest European academic centres founded in 1364. The access from the Krakow's railway station is easy: there are busses, trams and taxis. The airport Kraków-Balice is some 5 km. from the conference site and there are direct busses and a taxi stand. Participation and registration:

There is no registration fee. The participants will pay accommodation and boarding directly to the conference centre during their stay. The hotel booking, questions and requirements concerning rooms, the participants' advice of arrival/departure date, etc. should be sent using the registration form that will be published later on CS&P 2009 Web pages.

The hotel should be booked not later than by 31st August 2009.

Organization of time:

There will be two days (28th and 29th September) of parallel working sessions. The third day is reserved for special events.
